ADOPTION STATEMENT

This statement has been prepared in accordance with Regulation 24(4) and Regulation 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004 and hereby gives notice that South Holland District Council formally adopted the South Holland Statement of Community Involvement on the 12th December 2006 as modified in accordance with the Inspector's Binding Report received on the 12th October 2006.

The South Holland Statement of Community Involvement covers the whole of the South Holland District and sets out how the Council intends to consult the public and other interested parties on the plan making process and on individual planning applications.

The Statement of Community Involvement and the Inspector's Report of the Independent Examination can be viewed at the following locations:

- Council Offices, Priory Road, Spalding. On Mondays to Thursdays from 8.30am to 5.15pm, and on Fridays from 8.30am to 4.45pm.
- Market House, Long Sutton. On Mondays to Thursdays from 8.30am to 5.00pm, and on Fridays from 9.30am to 4.00pm.
- At the public libraries in Spalding, Holbeach, Long Sutton, Crowland and Donington during their normal opening hours.
- The document may also be viewed on the Council's website (www.sholland.gov.uk).

High Court Challenge and Judicial Review

Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Council to adopt the Statement of Community Involvement may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the SCI is not within the appropriate powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or alternatively that a procedural requirement of the Act and its Associated Regulations has not been complied with. Any application must be made within three months of the date of adoption and as such will expire on the 12th March 2007.
