


Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRC)

Remember you can take your additional rubbish and recycling to the Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRC)

Items that CANNOT be placed in any of your household sacks



Clothing and textiles
These can be taken to charity shops, community based bring banks, or your local HWRC



Batteries
These should be taken back to retailers who will recycle them safely



Electrical items
These should be taken to your local HWRC



Remember, if you use a third party to take your rubbish away, they must have a waste carrier license. If it is fly-tipped,

YOU may be fined a minimum £400



Recycling must be:

Clean

Where needed rinse the items you are recycling - any food or liquid left will contaminate other recycling

Dry

Wet items can also contaminate other recycling

Loose

Don't put carrier bags or sacks in to your recycling

Plastic bags should not be placed into your green sacks, but can usually be recycled through your local supermarkets.



Your non-recyclable waste is sent to the 'Energy from Waste' plant in North Hykeham, where it is burned, which generates enough electricity to power 29,000 homes each year.

Section 46 notice

LEGAL NOTICE - In accordance with the Environmental Protection Act 1990, Section 46, South Holland District Council gives notice that from 23rd September 2019 you may not put paper and card into your mixed dry recycling bag. Failure to comply with this may result in your Green Sack not being collected and /or other enforcement action.

- Cardboard e.g. cereal boxes
- Egg boxes
- Envelopes
- Junk mail
- Newspapers and magazines
- Paper bags
- Greetings cards and wrapping paper (without any glitter or foil)
- Catalogues

- Take-away containers including pizza boxes
- Shredded paper or tissues
- Books
- Paper that has been used for painting or has glue on it

Recyclable Items

Sorted in the UK to be
reused and reprocessed



Yes please

- Tin foil
- Aerosols
- Metal food and drink cans
- Yoghurt pots, butter / margarine tubs, trays
- Toiletry bottles
- Glass bottles and glass jars
- Plastic cleaning products bottles
- Plastic milk and drink bottles
- Lids from jars
- Biscuit and sweet tins
- Waxed juice cartons

If in doubt, leave it out!



Worried about landfill?

We do all we can to avoid sending rubbish to landfill. In fact, we have invested over £125 million in an 'energy from waste' plant which turns waste into green electricity - enough for 29,000 homes per year. This has allowed us to reduce the amount of rubbish going to landfill by 92%.

Paper and cardboard recycling trial

More than 7,500 homes in South Holland, Boston and North Kesteven are taking part in the paper and card recycling trial which will last at least a year. Collecting paper and card separately will reduce the contamination level which is not only good for the environment but it also commands a higher price which effectively reduces the cost of the service. It is planned that purple collections will ultimately be available throughout Lincolnshire.
