

Counter Terrorism Privacy Notice

What this Privacy Notice covers

Your privacy is very important to South Holland District Council.

South Holland District Council is the Data Controller responsible for the personal information you may provide in relation to the investigation and enforcement of anti-social behaviour and environmental crime.

Why we need your personal data

Your information will be used to assist in the prevention of terrorism.

The legal basis for processing your data is Article 6.1(c) of the General Data Protection Regulations, as it is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation under the Counter Terrorism and Security Act 2015.

It may be necessary to process data revealing your racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs or trade union membership and or data concerning your health, sex life or sexual orientation. Where this Special category data is required, it is processed under Article 9(2)(g) of the General Data Protection Regulations, for the reasons of substantial public interest, as the Council has a duty under the Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015 to assist in the prevention of individuals being drawn into terrorism.

How your data is used

The council has a duty in the exercise of its functions to have due regard to the need to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism.

When taking a report which relates to concerns about an individual the following details may be asked for:

- your name
- your address
- contact details
- details of how your concern.

The council would pass all details of the report onto the Lincolnshire Police.

The council also coordinates training for staff in relation to the 'prevent' strand of Counter Terrorism. Details that would be taken would include names and job titles.

The details will be kept on file for three years and then destroyed.



How long the information is kept for

Reports received in relation to concerns about an individual would be retained for a period of six years.

Details of those that have attended training would be retain for a period of three years.
