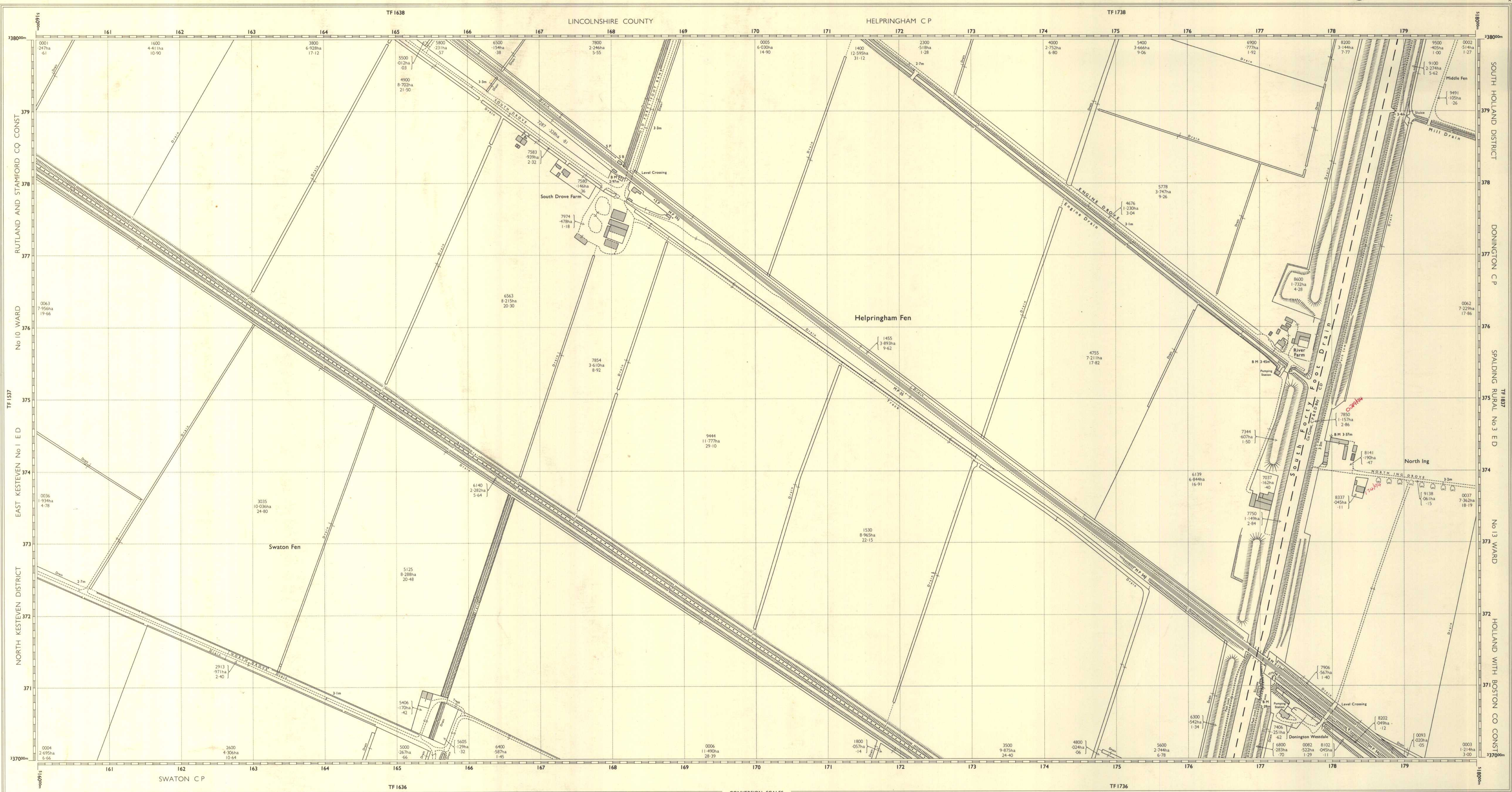

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0929

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number.....TQ

2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite the line on the north or south margin.....058

3. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite the line on the east or west margin.....291

4. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters followed by the Easting and then by the Northing.....TQ 058291

4267.....parcel number

1:057ha.....area in hectares

4.47.....area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.471 05

To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.404 69
