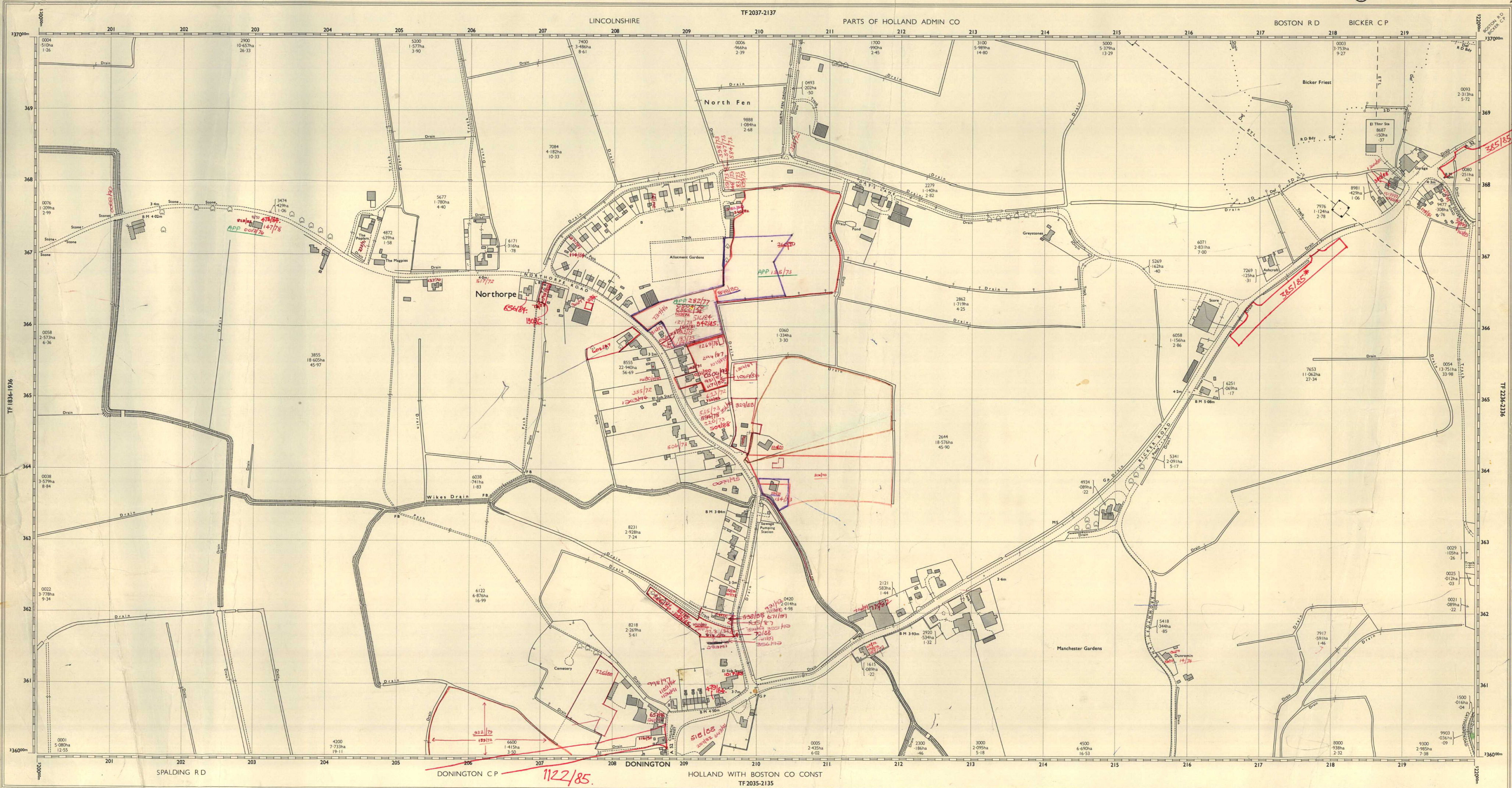

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the national grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point within 10 metres proceed as follows:

EXAMPLE: 4267 361

4267 easting number
361 northing number

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls. Enclosures or features joined for measurement of area
Limit of area within which individual parcels are not shown.

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.471 05
To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.404 69

Take west edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin.
Estimate area of metres from grid line to the point.

Take south edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin.
Estimate area of metres from grid line to the point.
