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AREAS

are measured in to plan only.

The number and area, in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE:	8400	parcel number
	1.07ha	area in hectares
	4.47	area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls. Exclusions or features pending for measurement of area are shown by dashed lines. Limited areas within which individual parcels are not shown.

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47005

To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.40469

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid line forms part of the National Grid and are in 100 metre intervals. To give a reference finding the position of a point to within 100 metres proceed as follows—

EASTING	EXAMPLE: 1	1 To the Grid	NORTHING
Take west end of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the margin to the south margin	363	Take easting of 100 metres square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or south west point	158
Estimate tens of metres from figure to the point	0	Estimate tens of metres from figure to the point	0
