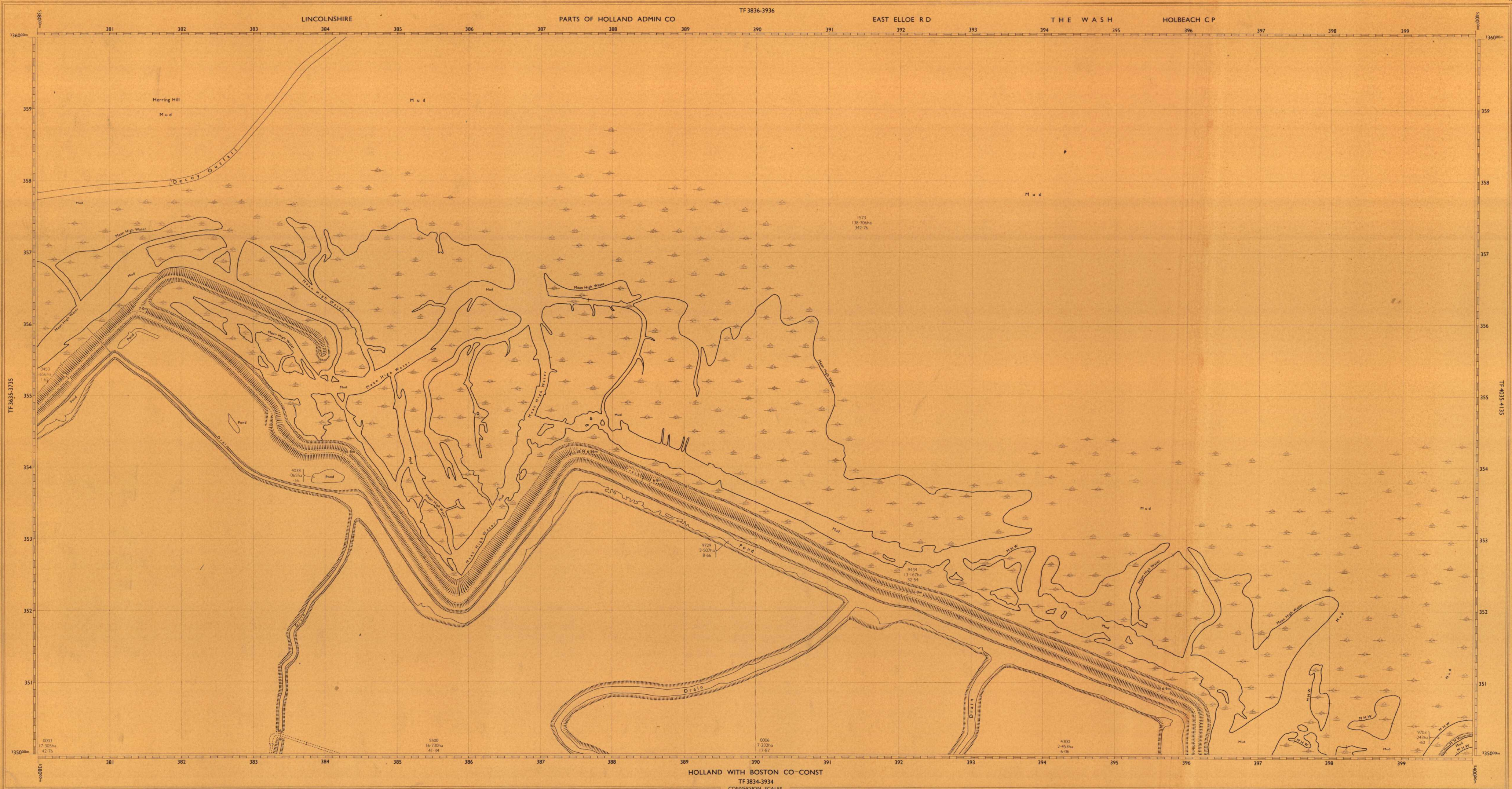

AREAS

The number and area in hectares (ha) and acres (a) is shown within each parcel of land.

Area measurement is to plan edge only.

EXAMPLE: 1.879ha 4.47a

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.

Enclosures or features joined for measurement of area are shown by a line on the north or south margin.

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47105.

To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.4047.

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

EXAMPLE: H in Herring Hill

EASTING	NORTHING
Take west edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or north margin.	Take south edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or north margin.
