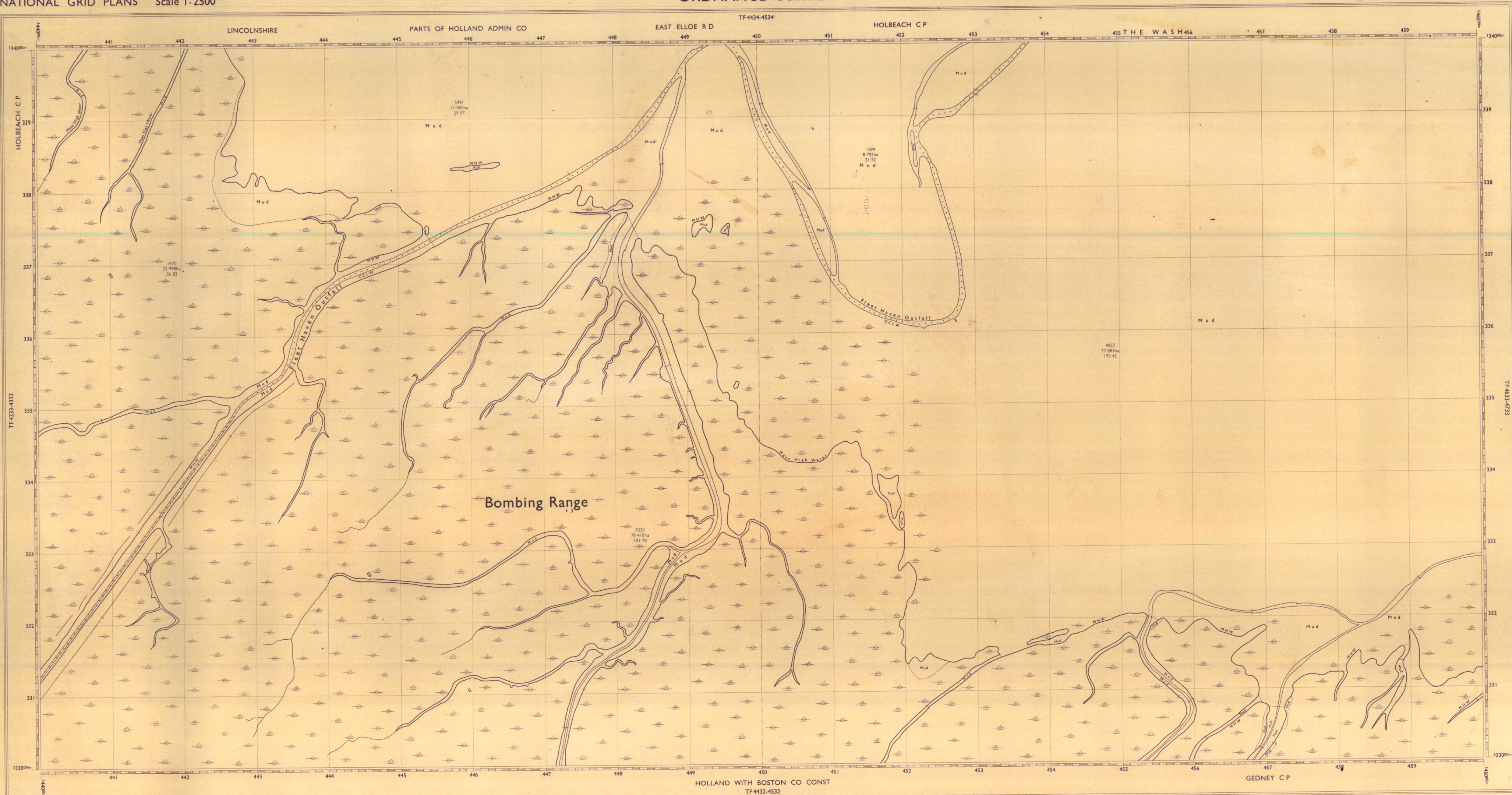

VEGETATION CLASSIFICATION

Where space permits, tree and scrub symbols in woods are shown in groups of four, three, two or single to indicate close, medium, open or scattered density of trees or scrub.

AREAS

Area measurement is to plan edge only.
The number and area in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.
EXAMPLE: 8400 parcel number
1:2500 scale (photographically reduced)
4.47 area in acres
When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.
Enclosures or features used for measurement of area.
To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47105.
To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.4047.

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point in within 10 metres proceed as follows—
EXAMPLE: 447 333
Take west edge of 100-metre square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin.
Estimate metres from grid line to the point.
