To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.4746

To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.4047

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are in 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

EASTING	NORTHING
Take east edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the north or south margin. Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point	Take south edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin. Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point
