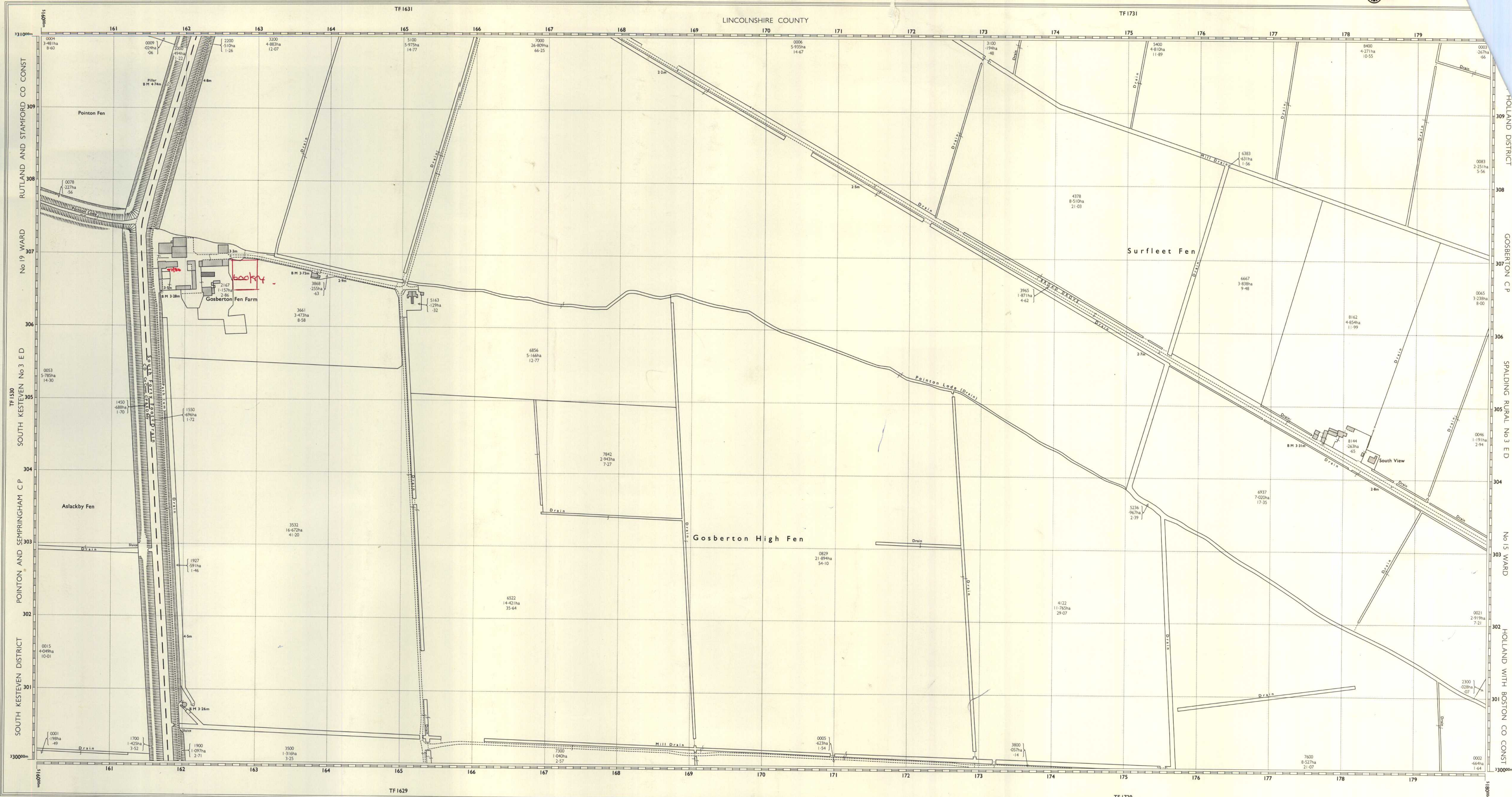

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:-

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number.....TQ

2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin.....058

3. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin.....291

4. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters followed by the Easting and then by the Northing.....TQ 058 291
