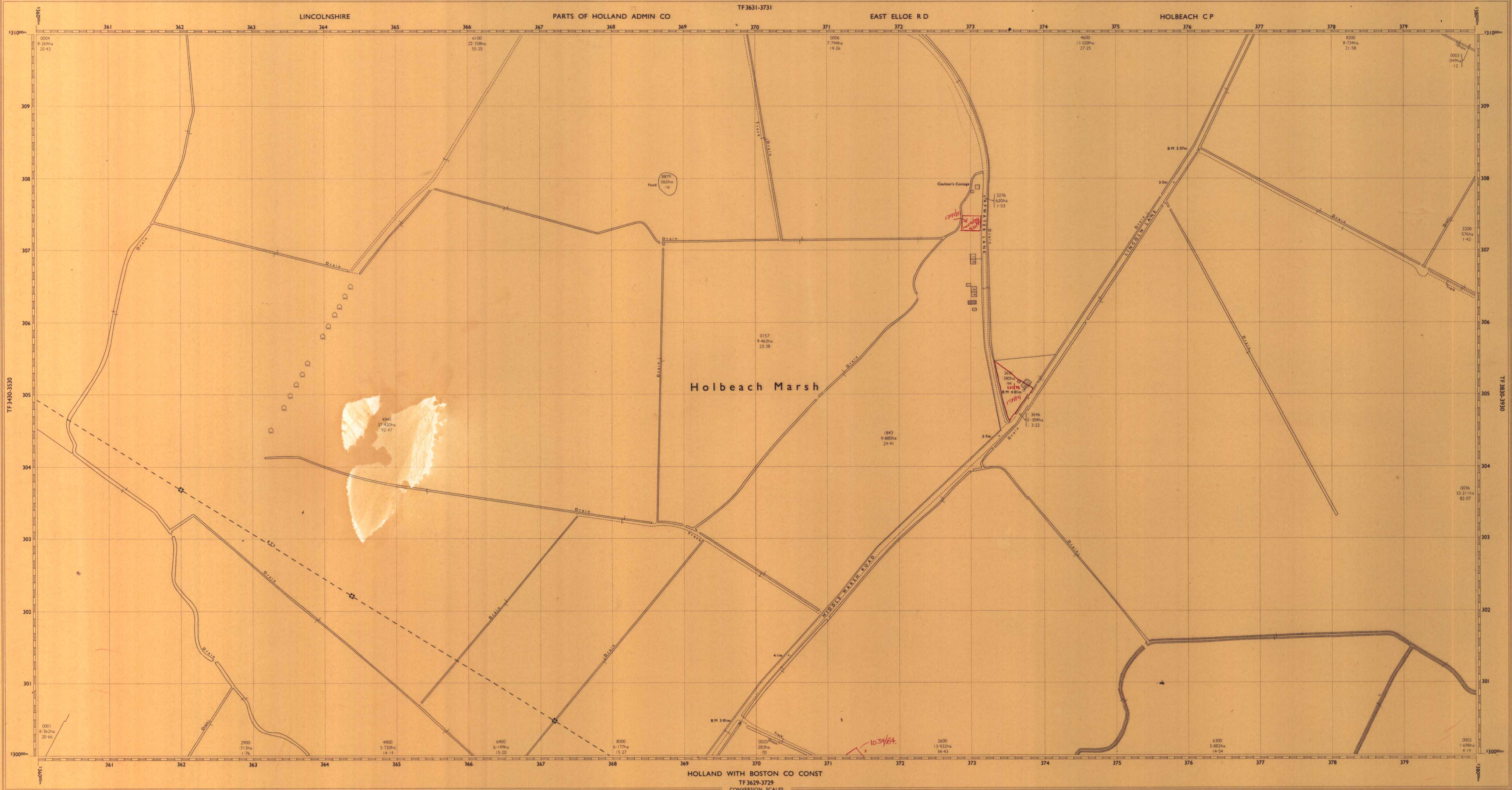

AREAS

Area measurement is to plus edge only.
The number and area in hectares and acres is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE: 8400 1-809ha 4-47a

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.
Limit of area within which individual parcels are not shown.
To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47105.
To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.4047.

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point or within 10 metres proceed as follows:

EXAMPLE: 372 307

EASTING: Take west edge of 100-metre square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin. Estimate tenths of metres from grid line to the point.

NORTHING: Take south edge of 100-metre square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin. Estimate tenths of metres from grid line to the point.
