AREAS

Area measurements in this plan are only to the nearest square metre.

The number and area, in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE: 4267.....parcel number
1.007ha.....area in hectares
2.47.....area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls. Enclosures or features joined for measurement of area.

Limit of area within which individual parcels are not shown.....1

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.471 05
To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.404 69

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point on the map, the grid reference is given by writing the letters of the grid square in which the point lies, followed by the Easting and then by the Northing.

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number.....TQ.....
2. Take the two letters of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin.....058
3. Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line to the point (distance 4).....8
The resulting four figure number is the Easting.....0588
4. Take the two letters of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin.....291
5. Estimate tenths of metres from the grid line to the point (distance 4).....4
The resulting four figure number is the Northing.....2914
The full six figure reference is given by writing the letters, followed by the Easting and then by the Northing.....TQ 05882914
