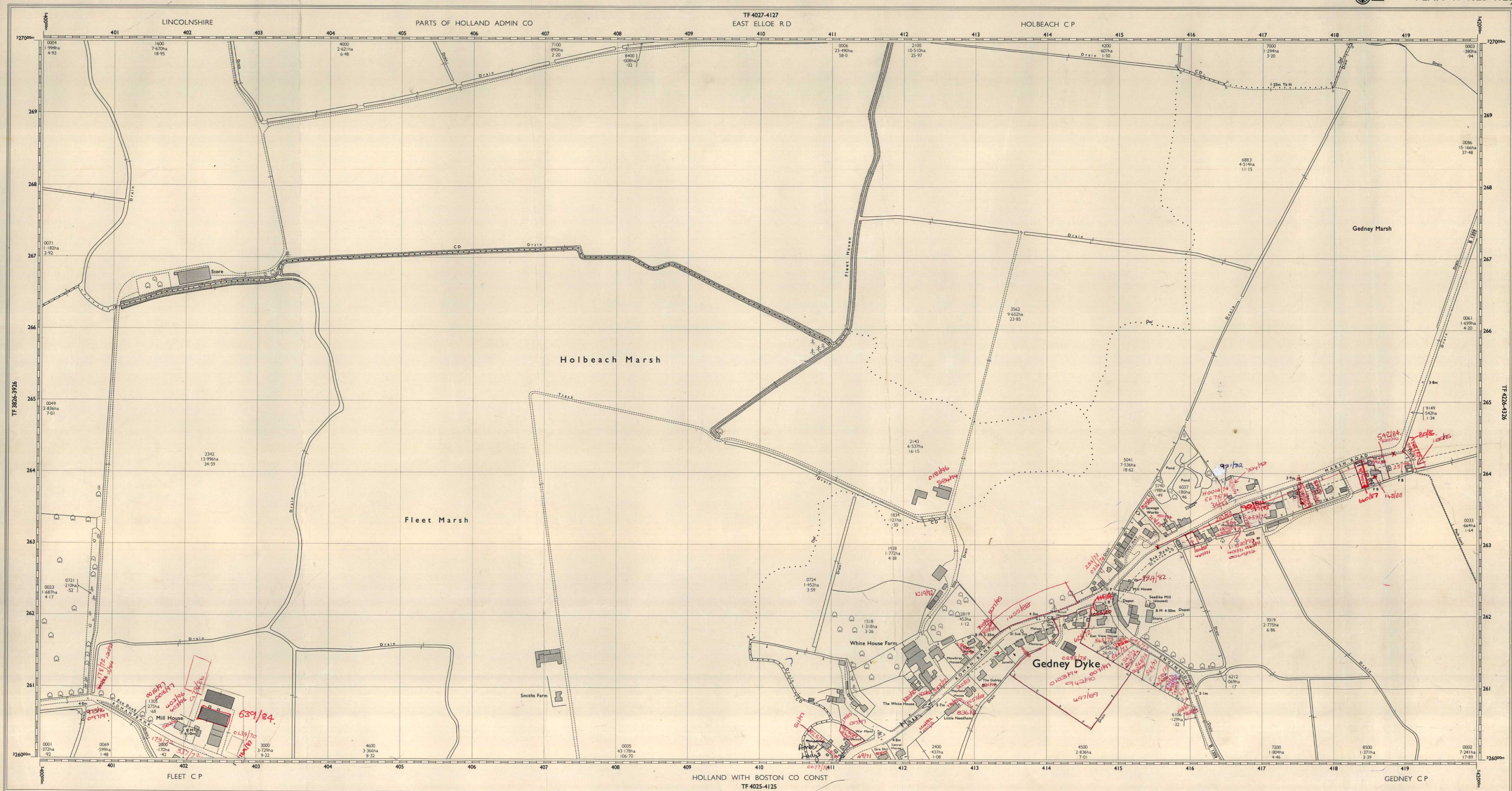

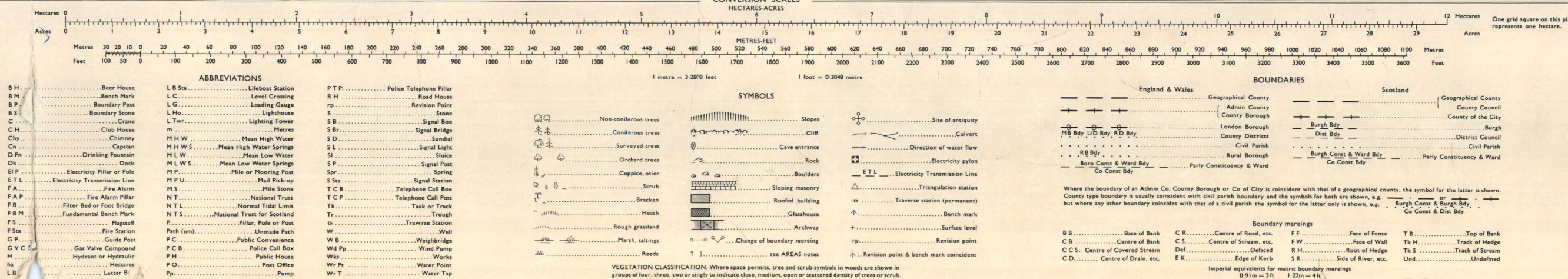
Surveys of changes since the publication of this plan may be available. Enquiries should be addressed to the Director General or to the local Ordnance Survey office.

HEIGHTS are given in METRES show the Newlyn Datum.

Bench marks, which may contain level information and particulars of bench marks to which no values have been shown, are obtainable from the Director General, Ordnance Survey.

Representations of the plan of a road, or path, or evidence of the existence of a right of way.

The alignment of tunnels where shown is approximate.



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One grid square on this plan represents one hectare.

Area measurement is to plan edge only.

The number and area, in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE: 1:1250 scale (photographically reduced)

4:257 parcel number

1:1250 scale (photographically reduced)

4:257 area in hectares

4:257 area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.

Enclosures or features joined for measurement of area.

Limit of area within which individual parcels are not shown.

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47105

To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.40469

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference

defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number

TQ 0529

2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and

read the figure opposite this line on the north or south margin

Estimate tens of metres from the grid line to the point (distance) 8

The resulting four figure number is the Easting

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529

3. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and

read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin

Estimate tens of metres from the grid line to the point (distance) 6

The resulting four figure number is the Northing

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529

4. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters

TQ 0529

followed by the Easting and then by the Northing
