



AREA

The number and area, in hectares (ha) and acres, is shown within each parcel of land.

EXAMPLE:	8400	parcel number
	1 (80%)	area in hectares
	2 (20%)	area in acres

When identifying a parcel it is important to specify the number of the plan on which it falls.
 Endpoints or features plotted on the plan are shown as follows:

Limit of area within which individual parcels are not shown 9

To convert hectares to acres multiply by 2.47457
 To convert acres to hectares multiply by 0.4047

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point within 10 metres proceed as follows—

EXAMPLE:	B in Green Sand	
EASTING		NORTHING
Take east edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the north or south margin	511	Take south edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin
Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point	1	Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point
