NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE		
The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:-		
EXAMPLE	W 1000000	NORTHING
EASTING Take west edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the north or south margin Estimate tens of metres from grid line to the point	495 0 4950	Take south edge of 100 metre square in which point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin Estimate units of metres from grid line to the point

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a reference defining the position of a point in 10 metres proceed as follows:
