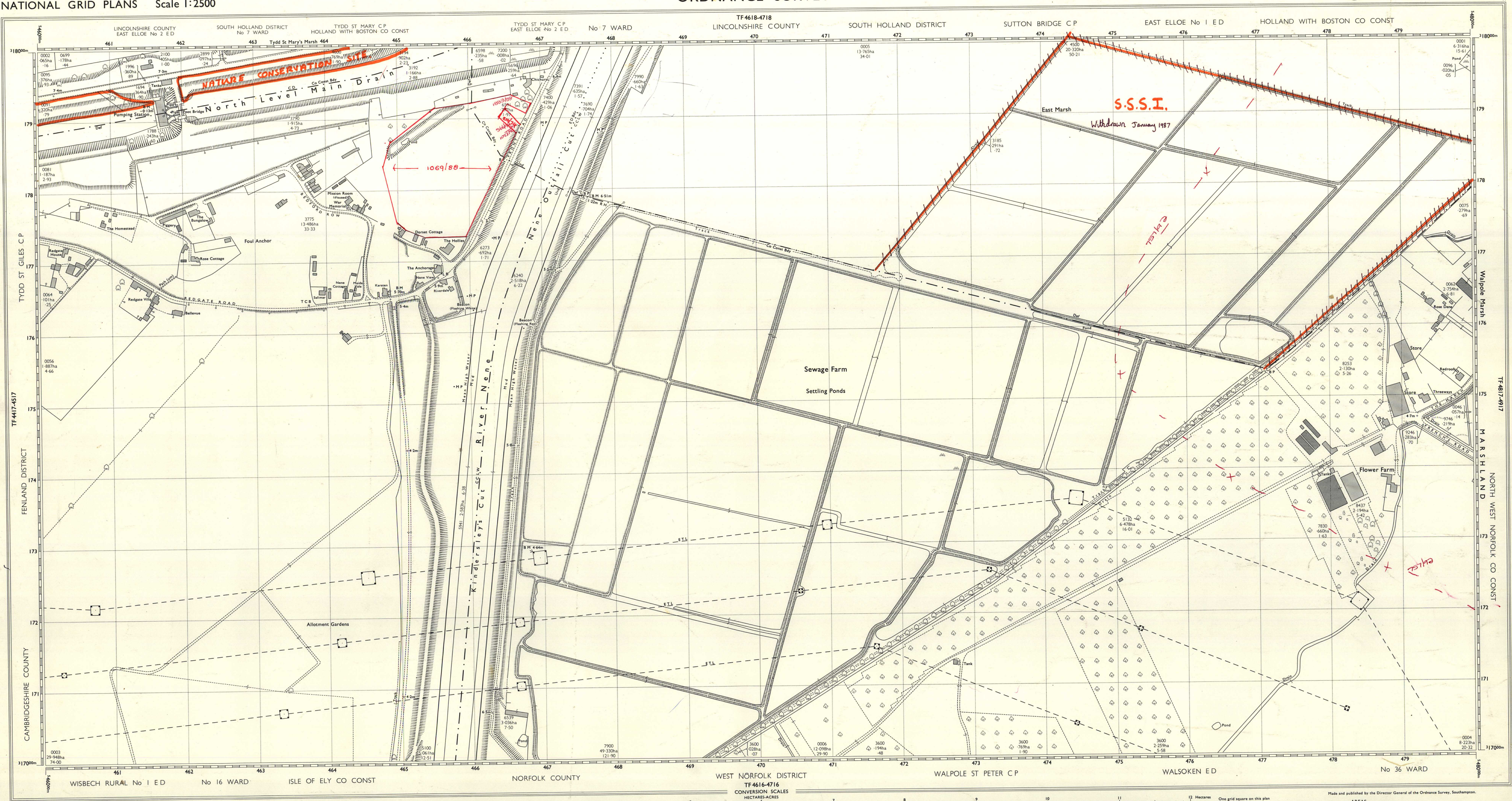

NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows:

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number. TO

2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin. 08

3. Take the east edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite this line on the east or west margin. 29

4. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters, followed by the Easting and then by the Northing. TO 0829

VEGETATION CLASSIFICATION Where space permits, tree and scrub symbols in woods are shown in groups of four, three, two or singly to indicate close, medium, open or scattered density of trees or scrub.
