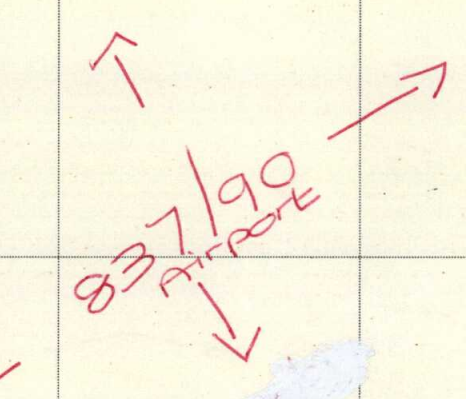

The grid lines form a reference system for defining the position of the enclosure.

1. Take the two letters of the enclosure number.
2. Take the west coordinate of the enclosure number and estimate tens of miles. The resulting figure is the west coordinate.
3. Take the south coordinate of the enclosure number and estimate tens of miles. The resulting figure is the south coordinate.
4. The full ten mile square followed by the letters of the enclosure number.
