NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form a part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference the position of a point is given and 10 metre processed as follows—

EXAMPLE from sheet TQ 0529

1. Take the two figures preceding the sheet number— TQ 0529
2. Take the west edge of the grid square and read the figures opposite the line on the north or south margin— 275
3. Estimate metres of metres from the grid line to the point— 058
4. The resulting four figure number is the Easting— 0588
5. Take the south edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figures opposite the line on the north or south margin— 291
6. Estimate metres of metres from the grid line to the point (distance— 291
7. The resulting four figure number is the Northing— 2916
8. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters, followed by the Easting and then by the Northing— TQ 05882916
