NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point to within 10 metres proceed as follows—

EXAMPLE: From sheet TQ 0529

1. Take the two letters preceding the sheet number: TQ

2. Take the west edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the north or south margin: 291

3. Take the east edge of the grid square in which the point lies and read the figure opposite this line on the east or west margin: 291

4. The resulting four figure number is the Northing

5. The full six figure reference is given by writing first the letters, followed by the Easting and then by the Northing: TQ 0582916

COINCIDENT BOUNDARIES

Coincident boundaries are shown by the first appropriate symbol above, e.g. Boro Const & E.D. Bay

For Ordnance Survey purposes County Boundary is deemed to be the limit of the parish structure whether or not a parish area exists.
