NATIONAL GRID REFERENCE

The grid lines form part of the National Grid and are at 100 metre intervals. To give a unique reference defining the position of a point within 10 metres proceed as follows:-

EXAMPLE FROM TASK 057

1. Take two figures preceding the sheet number TQ
read the west edge of the grid line on the east margin 392
2. read the figures opposite this line on the north or south margin 058
Estimate tens of metres from the grid line on the east margin
3. The resulting four figure number is the Easting 0588
+
4. Take the south edge of the grid square in which point lies 291
5. read the figures opposite this line on the east margin 291
Estimate tens of metres from the grid line to the point (distance 291
from the bottom left corner) e
6. The full ten metre reference is given by writing first the letters TQ 058291e

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
