



ECO Flex: Householder Application Form

ECO Flex allows local authorities to extend the eligibility criteria of the Energy Company Obligation (ECO4) scheme. This form allows households to apply to South Holland District Council (SHDC) for the ECO Flex scheme as detailed in the Statement of Intent on the website: https://www.sholland.gov.uk/article/24145/Energy-Company-Obligation-4-ECO4. Please also refer to the ECO Flex Guidance for Householders document for further details.

Households are able to indicate on this form which of the four available routes they may qualify under and share their personal details with their local authority or eligibility assessor.

All potentially eligible households should apply through SHDC, YES Energy Solutions or Sureserve Ltd (formerly Everwarm Ltd) to ensure that they can either benefit from the scheme or be assessed for eligibility under any other relevant programme.

These health conditions may be cardiovascular, respiratory, immunosuppressed, or		
limited mobility related.		
Route 4: Bespoke Targeting EPC band D-G owner-occupied households and private		
rented sector E-G households that are referred under Route 4: Bespoke Targeting.		
Suppliers and LAs can submit an application to ESNZ where they have identified a low		
income and vulnerable household, who are not already eligible under the exiting routes		

This form must be forwarded to SHDC on your behalf by your ECO installer.

SHDC will charge the installer for processing the application, the installer should not pass this charge onto the householders.
